SEASHORE ETIQUETTE

ME TIAKI I NGĀ KARAREHE O TE TAHATAI SHOW RESPECT FOR SEASHORE CREATURES



- Āta hīkoi Tread carefully.
- Waiho atu i ngā kararehe ki te wāhi kua kitea e koe Leave creatures where you found them.
- Waiho atu i ngā rimurimu e piri ana ki ngā toka Leave attached seaweed in place.
- Kia ngāwari tō pā atu i ngā kararehe kia mākū hoki ō ringaringa, me pātata i ki te whenua Handle creatures with care - close to the ground with wet hands.
- Āta whakahoki i ngā toka ki ō rātou wāhi tika i kitea ai e koe Carefully put rocks back to the same position you found them.
- Kia iti te kohikohi anga, he kāinga ēnei mō ētahi atu kararehe Limit your collection of empty shells as other creatures use them as homes.

KAROHIA TE RAWEKE I NGĀ KARAREHE AVOID DISTURBING WILDLIFE



- Me noho tawhiti koe i ngā manu o te moana Keep your distance from seabirds including penguins.
- Me noho tawhiti koe i ngā pakaka me ngā whakahao Keep your distance from seals and sea lions.
- Whakamahia te arotahi topa o tau kamera, tau karu whakatata rānei hei titiro tata
 - Use the zoom on your camera or binoculars for close viewing. Ki te pātata mai tētahi whakahao – me āta neke whakamuri
- If sea lions approach you back away slowly.
- Me pupuri ngā kuri Keep dogs under control.

KIA TŪPATO KIA TIKA HOKI TŌ MAHI BE CAREFUL AND KEEP SAFE



- 巻 Me aro atu ki ngā wā tai timu, tai pari, kia kore e pāngia e te tai pari
 - Check tide times to avoid being cut off by rising tide.
- A Me aro atu koe ki ngā tohu huarere Do not explore the seashore alone.
- Kia mataara ki ngā ngaru kaua e huri tuarā ki te moana Look out for waves - never turn your back to the ocean.
- Kia tūpato i ngā wāhi toka māniania, pāhiwihiwi hoki Beware of slippery and uneven rock surfaces.
 - Kohia ngā para kua kitea i te tahatai, ka whiua ki te wāhi para kē Pick up any rubbish found on the shore and dispose of it appropriately.
